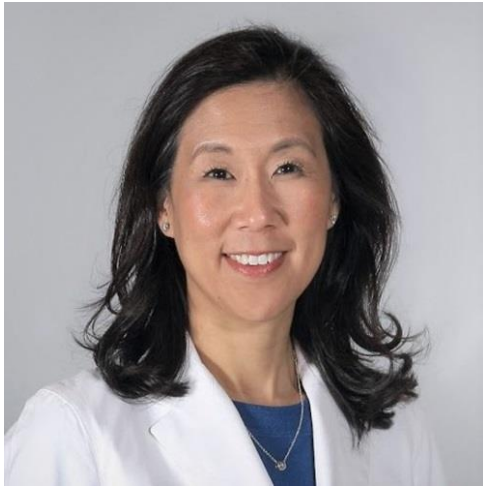




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Susan Walley serves as Chief of the Division of Hospital Medicine at Children's National Hospital and Professor of Pediatrics at the George Washington University School of Medicine and Health Sciences. Dr. Walley completed her medical degree from Medical College of Georgia, internship and residency in Pediatrics at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, and a Master of Health Care Management from the Harvard University School of Public Health. She is on the Board of Directors for the Campaign for Tobacco Free Kids and practices clinically as a pediatric hospitalist and certified tobacco treatment specialist.
